



#### Early Childhood Development Fund lends a hand to educating our pre-school children



A local fund, the Early Childhood Development Fund, was established in 2019 at the McKean County Community Foundation to assist families with financial needs in obtaining early childhood education for their children. In 2021, this fund awarded a number of area children and their families with \$3,690 in tuition assistance for pre-school programs.

The Early Childhood Development Fund (ECDF) has a mission to support accessible child-centered care with tuition assistance. The fund is primarily established to support families that have children enrolled in Early Childhood Programs who are at risk of pulling their child from the program due to unforeseen financial hardships. Non-profit agencies that provide early childhood education in the McKean County area are able to recommend a student/family with special financial needs to obtain funding assistance through the ECDF fund to help their child attend a qualifying program.



### Martha A. Eddy Memorial Scholarship Fund

Martha A. Eddy was a life-long resident of Bradford. She was a 1965 graduate of Bradford Central Christian High School. After high school she attended Villa Maria College in Erie, and St. Bonaventure University in Alleghany, NY, graduating with her bachelor's and master's degree in education. She dedicated her career to elementary education, teaching at St. Bernard's School, Earl J. Hyatt and Hobson Place School until poor health and her battle with brain cancer forced her early retirement in 1975. Despite these health challenges, she continued her deep commitment to strong education for children, donating her time and money to Catholic education in Bradford as well as tutoring local students until her health declined significantly and she passed in 1990. This scholarship was established by her family for Bradford Area High School graduates pursuing a degree in education or a health related field. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually.

#### Bernard Feiro Memorial Fund

This newly established scholarship is given in memory of Bernard Feiro. Bernard was an 11-year-old that was hit and killed by a gotf ball in 1951 when he was caddying at a local gotf course. His brother Hugh continues to have fond memories of his brother after 70 years and Hugh's wife and daughter wanted to honor Hugh on his 85th birthday with the establishment of this scholarship in honor of his brother. This scholarship is open to any member of the Bradford Area High School golf team at Bradford Area High School who is pursuing a post-secondary education.

### Pink Langainese Memorial Scholarship Fund

Michael A. Langianese III, better known as Pink, was a very community minded individual. He graduated in 1979 from Bradford Central Christian High School. For 40 years he worked and managed his family's business, Bradford City Beers, Inc. He ended his career at the Winery at Wilcox as the General Manager. Pink served on a variety of charitable committees throughout McKean County which included Ski for Cancer, Charity Golf events, and sponsored the Pine Acres Junior Golf Program. He was an avid sportsman, hunter and golfer. He so loved the outdoors. He was many things to many people, but his prized role was that of an extrernely proud family man. A scholarship will be awarded annually to a Bradford Area High School senior pursuing a post-secondary vocational career/tech program.

#### Grow Rural PA Fund

This mission of this new fund is to improve the economies and quality of life for citizens of rural Pennsylvania and to encourage population growth for future sustainability. With a vision of vibrant, rural towns with equal access to resources to ensure their future viability in a global economy, the fund will focus on identifying barriers and inequities faced by rural communities (geographic inequality) in north central/northwestern Pennsylvania. It will provide direct service to communities along with policy recommendations to local, state and federal governments. Grow Rural PA will work with rural communities to help them grow and thrive.









### Susan Swanson Memorial Internship Fund sponsored by AHUG

The AHUG (Allegheny Hardwood Utilization Group) Board of Directors established the Susan Swanson Memorial Internship Fund to honor Sue's legacy and contribution to Pennsylvania's forests and forest products community. Susan was a lifelong resident of the Kane area and was involved in Pennsylvania's hardwood industry for over 40 years, with a career that went from providing administrative support to her husband's logging business, to taking over as the AHUG Executive Director. Under her leadership, AHUG fostered a reputation for being the "go-to" organization in our region on issues involving the hardwood industry. She forged strong working relationships on the local, state and national level. Along with her impressive career, Susan was a devoted wife, mother and grandmother and an active member of the community. In addition to the scholarship, this award offers an 8-week internship with multiple job shadow opportunities at AHUG with the North Central/Northwestern PA Region.

### Joanna C. Fecek Memorial Scholarship Fund sponsored by Catholic Daughters of the Americas

The Joanna C. Fecek Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 1992 by Thomas MacDonald to honor the memory of his mother Joanna. Joanna was a long time member of Court Callistus #66 of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas. Having served that organization in many different offices including as Grand Regent several times, Joanna viewed the CDA as central to her life as a woman of faith. The Joanna Fecek Memorial Scholarship is intended to provide financial assistance to students from St. Callistus Church who are pursuing careers in the human services. \$500 will be awarded to a Kane Area High School senior pursuing a degree in a human services field who is a member of St. Callistus Church.

### Butch & Peg Hannold Donor Advised Fund

This fund was established by Peg Hannold after the passing of her husband, Charles "Butch" Hannold, to support the community that they called home. Butch worked for 40 years at Kane Handle. He was an avid sports fan and a lifelong New York Yankees fan, and is remembered by his family as a homebody with a warm and generous heart. Butch and Peg's fund will offer a helping hand to charitable organizations recommended by the donors and their family.

### Hannold Family Memorial Scholarship Fund

In the process of establishing this scholarship Charles "Butch" Hannold passed away suddenly. Originally the scholarship was created in memory of Judith and Eric Hannold by Charles "Butch" & Peggy Hannold. This scholarship will now be designated in memory of Judith, Eric and Butch Hannold. Eric's mom Judith passed away at a young age and Eric had wanted to do something to honor his mom. Upon Eric's passing, his family fulfilled his wish by honoring both his morn and Eric. Eric. a graduate of the Kane High School Class of 1992, worked as an international tax account with Marriott. Hotels, PNC and Highmark, He was an avid fisherman and a devoted fan of the New York Yankees and Pittsburgh Steelers. Butch worked at Kane Handle for over 40 years and was also an avid sports fan and a lifelong NY Yankees fan since the 1950's. Two awards will be given: \$500 for a Kane Area High School senior member of the high school cross country or track teams, and \$1,000 to a senior pursuing a degree in the business field.

### Jerry & Nancy Haberberger Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Haberberger Memorial Scholarship Fund was started by their children, Tom and Karen, and their families, to honor their parents. Jerry and Nancy resided in Kane for the majority of their married life. Nancy was an English teacher in the Warren County School District for over 32 years and Jerry was employed by the Kane branch of UPS for over 30 years. They were both very involved with their church, St. Callistus, and their community. They enjoyed bowling at the Elks Club where they bowled for decades. Hard work, determination, and giving back were at the forefront of everything they did. For many years, they volunteered at the Lutheran Home in Kane, where Jerry's mother, Margaret, was a resident, and later on when Nancy's father, Louie, was a resident. Nancy was a graduate of Kane High School class of 1960. This scholarship is open to a graduating senior that is a resident of the Kane Area School District who is pursuing a post-secondary 2 or 4-year degree or certificate program.



### Cinderellas Closet of Kane Scholarship Fund

The Cinderella Closet of Kane was a community based program that provided low cost new and used prom/formal attire rentals to high school girls in 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades in McKean, Elk, Warren, Forest, Cameron and Potter counties. Due to a variety of reasons the board decided to close their doors in the summer of 2021. After everything was liquidated in the store, the remaining funds have established this one-time scholarship program for graduating senior girls in 2022 in Elk and McKean Counties. Eight \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded in 2022. Graduating female seniors from all Elk and McKean County high schools pursuing post-secondary education are eligible.

# THE POWER OF ENDOWMENT

Opening a fund with McKean County Community Foundation is an easy way to launch your charitable giving strategy. In addition to offering a wide variety of funds, we handle the due diligence, issue checks and provide staff assistance through a wide range of donor services. Our flexibility allows you many options. The type of fund you select to establish is your choice. The type that works best for you and your charitable goals ultimately boils down to how involved you wish to be in making grants/distributions from your fund.

Donor Advised Funds - Endowed Established with a taxdeductible gift by individuals, families and companies who wish to actively participate in the grant making process. A percentage of the total fund can be awarded annually to charities recommended by you. The principal amount of money gifted will never be depleted. In this way, the fund will continue to give for good, forever. It is a great way of involving family members and succeeding generations in philanthropy.

Donor Advised Funds - Spend-Down Also called "Non-Endowed" funds. These are charitable checking accounts that support regular. ongoing grant activity. After establishing your fund at the Foundation. monies are immediately available for grant distribution to charities recommended by you. The money you provide has a finite existence. Unless additional funding is provided, the monies available for granting will run out over time. This type of fund can be used to take advantage of itemizing taxes on a rotating basis. See our article on "Bunching Strategy" on page 15.

Designated Funds With a designated fund, donors can support the good work of one or more specific nonprofit organizations. Almost any 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, municipality, or faith-based organization may be designated to receive support for its mission. You identify the recipient(s) and our staff manages the annual distribution of funds from the endowment.

Field of Interest Funds Donors pick their favorite, general charitable cause or field of interest. Donors can request the Foundation to award grants within defined spheres of interest such as the arts, health, education, the environment, or a geographic focus.

Unrestricted/Community Funds Unrestricted funds allow the greatest flexibility to the Community Foundation as it responds to emerging opportunities and unforeseen needs in the community. Income from these funds is used to award grants through our ongoing community grants process.

Scholarship Funds Although most of our scholarship funds target graduating high school seniors, you can establish a scholarship fund to help students at any grade level, from kindergarten to PhD. You choose the name of the scholarship, the eligibility criteria, and the award amount. The Foundation administers and manages all fiscal aspects of the fund - and most often the application, selection, and award processes as well.

Agency Endowment Funds These endowment funds are established by nonprofit organizations to provide perpetual income to them in support of their future operations. The Foundation handles all administrative and investment responsibilities.

How We Determine Our Spending Policy The spending policy allows the Community Foundation to pay out the most it can through its grant-making while enduring long-term growth of all permanently endowed funds. Generally, grants are not made from funds during the first year to best assure no deterioration of the original gift. Then annually, after reviewing market trends and current climate, the Board approves a spending policy for grant-making in the coming fiscal year. The spending policy of each endowment will be a percentage typically about 4% of the average market value over 3 years.



The "Bunching" Strategy?

may not be deductible on your tax return, depending on your ability to itemize in a given year. Charitable donations are deductible only if you itemize, which may be a less likely scenario for many taxpayers given today's higher standard deduction.

(In 2022, \$12,950 for individuals and \$25,900 for married couples).

How can taxpayers benefit from the new tax law and get back some of the tax advantages of their charitable contributions? One word: bunching. Essentially, this means combining perhaps several years' worth of donations into a single tax year so that - along with your other deductions - you exceed the standard deduction. (You'd take the standard deduction in the interim years.)

Of course, bunching multiple contributions into a single year can feel daunting if you're not sure how much you want to give and to whom. So to build some flexibility into your giving plan, you may wish to set up a donor-advised fund account at the Community Foundation, which allows you to donate a lump sum in the current tax year, invest the funds for future growth and parcel out the money to qualified charities over time. The money can continue to appreciate once invested in a donor-advised fund account, which means the potential for even greater giving down the road.
